*The Scripture Reading

Luke 8.26-39

Then they sailed to the country of the Gerasenes, which is opposite Galilee. ²⁷ When Jesus had stepped out on land, there met Him a man from the city who had demons. For a long time he had worn no clothes, and he had not lived in a house but among the tombs. ²⁸ When he saw Jesus, he cried out and fell down before Him and said with a loud voice, "What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg You, do not torment me." ²⁹ For He had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. (For many a time it had seized him. He was kept under guard and bound with chains and shackles, but he would break the bonds and be driven by the demon into the desert.) ³⁰ Jesus then asked him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Legion," for many demons had entered him. 31 And they begged Him not to command them to depart into the abyss. 32 Now a large herd of pigs was feeding there on the hillside, and they begged Him to let them enter these. So He gave them permission. ³³ Then the demons came out of the man and entered the pigs, and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the lake and were drowned. ³⁴ When the herdsmen saw what had happened, they fled and told it in the city and in the country. ³⁵ Then people went out to see what had happened, and they came to Jesus and found the man from whom the demons had gone, sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind, and they were afraid. ³⁶ And those who had seen it told them how the demon-possessed man had been healed. ³⁷ Then all the people of the surrounding country of the Gerasenes asked Him to depart from them, for they were seized with great fear. So He got into the boat and returned. ³⁸ The man from whom the demons had gone begged that he might be with Him, but Jesus sent him away, saying, ³⁹ "Return to your home, and declare how much God has done for you." And he went away, proclaiming throughout the whole city how much Jesus had done for him.



Praise

Call to Worship (everyone together)

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear though the earth gives way, though the mountains be moved into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble at its swelling.

"Jesus! What a Friend for Sinners!" (read or sing these words together)

Jesus! what a Friend for sinners! Jesus! lover of my soul; Friends may fail me, foes assail me, He, my Savior, makes me whole. Hallelujah! what a Savior! Hallelujah! what a Friend! Saving, helping, keeping, loving, He is with me to the end.

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Luke 8.26-39 (one person may read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- Do you think angels are real? What about bad angels, sometimes called "demons"?
- 2. Who is stronger: Jesus, good angels, or bad angels?
- 3. So why do we not have to be afraid of bad things, bad people, or bad angels?
- 4. When we know and love Jesus, what's one of the best things we can do for Him? (*Verse 39*)

Questions for older children

- 1. Why does it appear that there were so many more demons when Jesus was doing His ministry than there are now?
- 2. What is this miracle a picture of (and why)?
 - A) How Jesus can help one person with many wounds and hurts?
 - B) How the Kingdom of God "breaks in" on our lives?
 - C) How the church is to care for very sad and hurting people today?
 - D) All of the above?
- 3. What is keeping you from being "clothed and in your right mind" today?
- 4. Do you really believe Jesus can help you with these things? Really? Why or why not?

Scripture Memory for October: (memorize these verses of Scripture)
