Romans 3.21-26

But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it—²² the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: ²³ for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴ and are justified by His grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵ whom God put forward as a propitiation by His blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in His divine forbearance He had passed over former sins. ²⁶ It was to show His righteousness at the present time, so that He might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.



"The Greatest Miracle No One Ever Saw"

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Romans 3.21-26 (one person may read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. If valuable means "worth a lot," what's the most valuable thing you have? Why is it valuable to you?
- 2. To say something has glory means it has great value. Why do we say God has glory, or that He is glorious?
- 3. What might Paul mean when he says we "fall short of the glory of God"? That we're shorter than Him, or that we act in ways unlike Him?
- 4. What does Paul say God has done for us so that we can be close to God and let others see what God is like when they look at us?
- 5. How can we show God's glory—His value—in the choices we make?

Questions for older children

- 1. If a miracle is what can only be done by God, why is it miraculous that we are forgiven and accepted because of Jesus' death?
- 2. How would the fact that we are considered forever acceptable to God because of Jesus' death change the way you look at your frustrations? your fores?
- 3. When we are frustrated or afraid we tend to forget about the miracle of being found acceptable to God through Jesus. So how do we practice remembering?

Scripture Memory for November: (memorize these verses of Scripture)

Psalm 100 - A Psalm for giving thanks

Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth! Serve the LORD with gladness! Come into His presence with singing! Know that the LORD, He is God! It is He who made us, and we are His; we are His people, and the sheep of His pasture. Enter His gates with thanksgiving, and His courts with praise! Give thanks to Him; bless His name! For the LORD is good; His steadfast love endures forever, and His faithfulness to all generations.
