Luke 17.11-19

On the way to Jerusalem He was passing along between Samaria and Galilee. ¹² And as He entered a village, He was met by ten lepers, who stood at a distance ¹³ and lifted up their voices, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us." ¹⁴ When He saw them He said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went they were cleansed. ¹⁵ Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; ¹⁶ and he fell on his face at Jesus' feet, giving Him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan. ¹⁷ Then Jesus answered, "Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine? ¹⁸ Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" ¹⁹ And He said to him, "Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well."



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Luke 17.11-19 (one person may read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. Why do you think the lepers stood at a distance from Jesus?
- 2. What did the lepers say to Jesus?
- 3. What is mercy?
- 4. What did Jesus tell them to do? and why?
- 5. What happened when the one leper saw that he was healed?
- 6. Why do you think the other nine did not return to praise God?
- 7. What are you most thankful for about Jesus?

Questions for older children

- 1. Compare and contrast verse 13 and verses 15 and 16.
- 2. Imagine the scene as the ten lepers were cleansed. What do you think it looked like?
- 3. How are we often like the nine who did not return?
- 4. How can we become like the one who did return?
