

Order of Worship for the Home – The Week of December 30, 2012

Praise

Call to Worship (everyone together)

And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord."

"Away in a Manger" (read or sing these words together)

Away in a manger, no crib for a bed, The little Lord Jesus laid down His sweet head; The stars in the bright sky looked down where He lay, The little Lord Jesus, asleep on the hay.

Be near me Lord Jesus, I ask Thee to stay Close by me forever, and love me, I pray; Bless all the dear children in Thy tender care, And fit us for heaven, to live with Thee there.

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: John 10.9-11; Ephesians 2.10 (one person may read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. In John 10.9, Jesus compares Himself to a door. What are three things that Jesus says will happen if we enter through Him?
- 2. What kind of life may we have because of Jesus? (verse 10)
- 3. Read Psalm 23. What are some of the good things that David's Shepherd God did for him? Do you think He might do those things for you too?
- 4. Why does Jesus call Himself "the Good Shepherd"?
- 5. If Jesus laid down His life for you, what else do you think He might do for you?

Scripture Memory for December: (memorize these verses of Scripture)

Matthew 1.20-21

But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins."
