

## **Hearing and Learning God's Word**

**Scripture Reading:** Psalm 84.5-12 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

**Questions for Discussion** (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. When someone says they long for something, what do they mean?
- 2. What is something you long for?
- 3. What does the Psalmist long for in Psalm 84?
- 4. Why do you think he longs for this?
- 5. How can this Psalm help us long for the same things the Psalmist longs for?

#### Questions for older children

- 1. What strikes you about the Psalmist's longing?
- 2. What is the greatest longing of your life?
- 3. How can we as a church have this same longing?
