We Hear and Respond to God's Word

Moses came and told the people all the words of the LORD and all the rules. And all the people answered with one voice and said, "All the words that the LORD has spoken we will do." Exodus 24.3 The Rev. Dr. Joseph "Skip" Ryan 9:30/11:00

And He had to pass through Samaria. ⁵ So He came to a town of Samaria called Sychar, near the field that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. ⁶ Jacob's well was there; so Jesus, wearied as He was from His journey, was sitting beside the well. It was about the sixth hour. ⁷ A woman from Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give Me a drink." ⁸ (For His disciples had gone away into the city to buy food.) ⁹ The Samaritan woman said to Him, "How is it that You, a Jew, ask for a drink from me, a woman of Samaria?" (For Jews have no dealings with Samaritans.)

²⁷ Just then His disciples came back. They marveled that He was talking with a woman, but no one said, "What do You seek?" or, "Why are You talking with her?" ²⁸ So the woman left her water jar and went away into town and said to the people, ²⁹ "Come, see a man who told me all that I ever did. Can this be the Christ?" ³⁰ They went out of the town and were coming to Him. ³¹ Meanwhile the disciples were urging Him, saying, "Rabbi, eat." 32 But He said to them, "I have food to eat that you do not know about." ³³ So the disciples said to one another, "Has anyone brought Him something to eat?" ³⁴ Jesus said to them, "My food is to do the will of Him who sent me and to accomplish His work. ³⁵ Do you not say, 'There are yet four months, then comes the harvest'? Look, I tell you, lift up your eyes, and see that the fields are white for harvest. ³⁶ Already the one who reaps is receiving wages and gathering fruit for eternal life, so that sower and reaper may rejoice together. ³⁷ For here the saying holds true, 'One sows and another reaps.' ³⁸ I sent you to reap that for which you did not labor. Others have labored, and you have entered into their labor." 39 Many Samaritans from that town believed in Him because of the woman's testimony, "He told me all that I ever did." 40 So when the Samaritans came to Him, they asked Him to stay with them, and He stayed there two days. ⁴¹ And many more believed because of His word. ⁴² They said to the woman, "It is no longer because of what you said that we believe, for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is indeed the Savior of the world."




Psalm 104.5-13

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: John 4.4-9; 27-42 (one person may read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. In John 4, what did Jesus' followers see? Why did they complain?
- 2. What harvest did Jesus see that His followers could not see?
- 3. What did the Jewish people think about the Samaritans? How did they treat them?
- 4. What kinds of people do you try to avoid and not be friends with?
- 5. What kinds of people did Jesus Christ come into the world to save? How "big" is your Savior? How "big" is your world? How could your world, and your Savior, become "bigger" to you?

Questions for older children

- 1. In the Bible, "hospitality" means to make room in your ordinary, everyday life for people who are strangers or very different from you. In John 4, how was Jesus the perfect example of hospitality? How did Jesus welcome a stranger like a friend?
- 2. What attitudes kept Jesus' followers from showing hospitality to the Samaritans? What are some barriers and attitudes that keep you from showing hospitality to strangers and foreigners?
- 3. What is different between "seeing" a need for world missions, and having an "appetite" for missions? What are some practical ways that you and your family can develop a taste and an appetite for missions?
- 4. What does it mean to "sow"? What does it mean to "reap"? Why is sowing with tears more difficult than reaping with joy?
- 5. In John 4, who is the Sower, who did the "hard work" for us? How could you share the joy of Jesus by reaping?

Have you not known? Have you not heard? The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary; His understanding is unsearchable. ²⁹ He gives power to the faint, and to him who has no might He increases strength. ³⁰ Even youths shall faint and be weary, and young men shall fall exhausted; ³¹ but they who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint.
