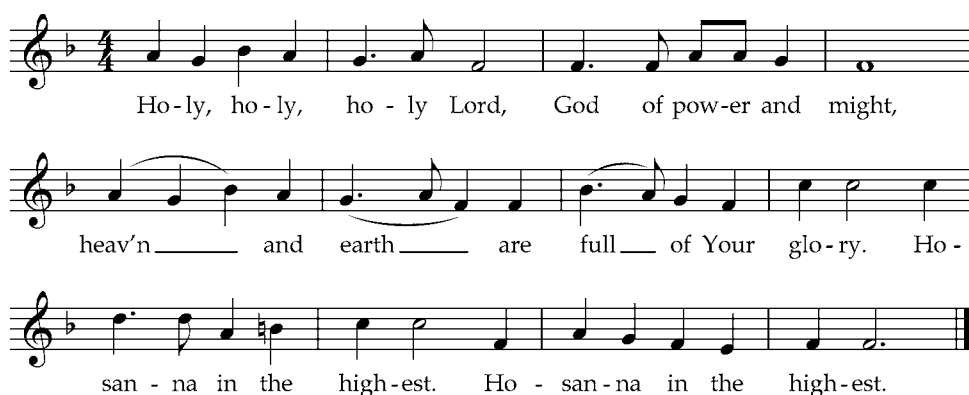

1. What makes you angry?
2. Do you think Jesus ever got angry?
3. What made Jesus angry?
4. Whenever we get angry, what do we need the most?
5. Can you think of a time when you were angry and Jesus loved you, and then you were happier?

Questions for older children

1. What does “hard-hearted” mean?
2. How often do you think of others who are less fortunate, or sick?
3. What do you think made Jesus so angry in this passage?
4. How can I keep from feeling guilty when I’m angry?
5. How does anger affect the way I think?
6. How does Jesus work through us to help others deal with their anger?
