



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Hebrews 12.1-3 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What does it mean to have joy?
- 2. What does it mean to look forward to something with joy? Can you think of a time you looked forward to something with joy?
- 3. What was the joy that was set before Christ?
- 4. What does it mean to fix our eyes on Jesus?
- 5. How is following Jesus like a race?
- 6. How does fixing our eyes on Jesus help us run the race?
- 7. What are we celebrating on Easter, and why is this so important to the race?

Questions for older children

- 1. What is your favorite Easter memory?
- 2. What is the difference between joy and happiness?
- 3. Describe the joy of Christ.
- 4. How can the joy of Christ help you in your walk?
- 5. What does it mean that He despised the shame of the cross?
