Minister: How was Christ exalted in His resurrection?

People:

Christ was exalted in His resurrection, in that, not having seen corruption in death (of which it was not possible for Him to be held), and having the very same body in which He suffered, with the essential properties thereof (but without mortality, and other common infirmities belonging to this life), really united to His soul, He rose again from the dead the third day by His own power; whereby He declared Himself to be the Son of God, to have satisfied divine justice, to have vanquished death, and him that had the power of it, and to be Lord of quick and dead: all which He did as a public person, the head of His church, for their justification, quickening in grace, support against enemies, and to assure them of their resurrection from the dead at the last day. 

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: I John 1.1-4 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. How did John prove that he was a witness to the person of Jesus?
- 2. Why does he tell us he is writing this letter?
- 3. When you hear the word "fellowship," what comes to your mind?
- 4. What does it mean that we have *fellowship with God the Father*, the Son and the Holy Spirit?
- 5. Why is fellowship important?

Questions for older children

- 1. How is Christian fellowship different than other types of communities of fellowships?
- 2. Is fellowship more than a building, an event, a gathering? Explain:
- 3. How can you increase your Christian fellowship? Why does it matter?
- 4. Are you supporting the "Fellowship" to the best of your ability?

Scripture Memory for April (memorize these verses of Scripture this month)

I John 1.5-7
