

I John 2.7-11

"Light and Darkness—Love and Hate"

Praise

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: I John 2.7-11 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What is a commandment?
- 2. What is the commandment that John is giving us in chapter 2.7-11?
- 3. How is this an old and a new commandment?
- 4. Read John 13.34-35. How does this connect to 1 John 2.7-11?
- 5. What does *light and darkness* have to do with *love and hate*?
- 6. How can we show love to our brothers and sisters in Christ?
- 7. Why can it be hard to show love?
- 8. Who do we rely on for help? (See 1 John 3.16)

Questions for older children

- 1. Of all the reasons Pastor Davis listed as being difficulties in love, which is most present in your life? (*Personality, Preferences, Pain, Position, Preferences, Pride*) Why?
- 2. How can love show the world that we are His disciples?
- 3. Why is 1 John 3.16 critical to our pursuit of loving our brothers and sisters in Christ?
- 4. What does it mean to be "doubly blind"?

Scripture Memory for April (memorize these verses of Scripture this month)

I John 1.5-7

This is the message we have heard from Him and proclaim to you, that God is light, and in Him is no darkness at all. ⁶ If we say we have fellowship with Him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. ⁷ But if we walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin.
