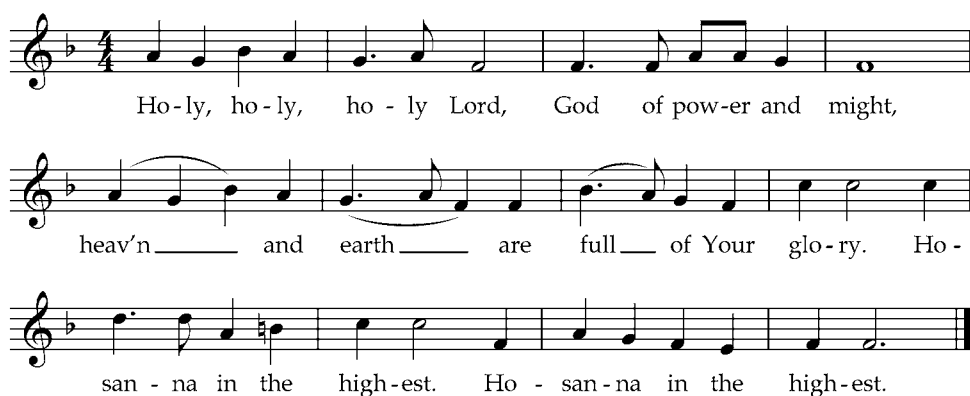

Hearing and Learning God’s Word

Scripture Reading: Galatians 5.16-23 *(one person read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. What is your favorite fruit?
2. Would you prefer to eat a fruit that is not ripe, or one that is ripened? Explain.
3. Have you ever eaten a fruit that tastes worse than it looks? How did you feel?
4. What are some differences between wax fruit and real fruit?
5. Do trees look better with blossoms, or with fruits hanging from their branches?
6. How does God help farmers to grow fruit trees?

Questions for older children

1. Why do fruits take so long to ripen?
2. Why does Paul compare the “fruit of the Spirit” with the “works of the flesh”?
3. Why is Love mentioned first of all?
4. How can we work with the Holy Spirit in bearing more fruit in our lives?
