



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Galatians 5.16-23 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What is your favorite fruit?
- 2. Would you prefer to eat a fruit that is not ripe, or one that is ripened? Explain.
- 3. Have you ever eaten a fruit that tastes worse than it looks? How did you feel?
- 4. What are some differences between wax fruit and real fruit?
- 5. Do trees look better with blossoms, or with fruits hanging from their branches?
- 6. How does God help farmers to grow fruit trees?

Questions for older children

- 1. Why do fruits take so long to ripen?
- 2. Why does Paul compare the "fruit of the Spirit" with the "works of the flesh"?
- 3. Why is Love mentioned first of all?
- 4. How can we work with the Holy Spirit in bearing more fruit in our lives?
