- 5. Do you, relying upon God for strength, promise to discharge the duties God shall set before you through your mission agency and through PCPC?


Question to the Congregation



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Philippians 4.6-7 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What does it mean to be anxious?
- 2. What sorts of things make you anxious?
- 3. What does this passage tell us to do when we become anxious?
- 4. How can prayer help us to not be anxious?
- 5. How will God help us when we pray?

Questions for older children

- 1. What is peace? What is the *peace of God*?
- 2. How does the heart and mind create anxiety?
- 3. How can the peace of God guard our hearts and minds?
- 4. How can we trust Christ through prayer to live more peaceful lives?
- 5. If we don't experience much peace, what does this reveal about our faith?
