But understand this, that in the last days there will come times of difficulty. ² For people will be lovers of self, lovers of money, proud, arrogant, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, ³ heartless, unappeasable, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not loving good, ⁴ treacherous, reckless, swollen with conceit, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, ⁵ having the appearance of godliness, but denying its power. Avoid such people.

^{3.16} All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, ¹⁷ that the man of God may be competent, equipped for every good work.

^{4.1} I charge you in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and by His appearing and His Kingdom: ² preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching. ³ For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions, ⁴ and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths.



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: 2 Timothy 3.1-5; 3.16-4.4 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. How does Paul describe times of difficulty in 2 Timothy 3.1-5?
- 2. Why do you think people act this way?
- 3. How does this relate to their view of God's word?
- 4. How does 2 Timothy 3.16 describe God's word?
- 5. What does this mean for God's people?
- 6. What is sound teaching and what are "itching ears"?
- 7. Pray that God gives you and your family and our church a greater desire to know and live His word.

Questions for older children

- 1. How does 2 Timothy 3.1-5 connect to 2 Timothy 4.3-4?
- 2. How is this present in the world you live in?
- 3. Where is 2 Timothy 3.16-17 being applied in your life?
- 4. What is Paul's strong charge to Timothy?
- 5. Where in your life might you have "itching ears"? What should you do about it?
