DARWALL

The whole counsel of God concerning all things necessary for His own glory, man's salvation, faith and life, is either expressly set down in Scripture, or by good and necessary consequence may be deduced from Scripture: unto which nothing at any time is to be added, whether by new revelations of the Spirit, or traditions of men. Public Confession of Sin



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Deuteronomy 4.1-2; Luke 24.44-48; Revelation 22.18-19 (*one person read the Scripture aloud*)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. How many books are in the Old Testament?
- 2. How many books are in the New Testament?
- 3. What does the word *canon* mean as Pastor Davis used it?
- 4. Why were some books selected to be in the Bible and others were not?
- 5. Is the canon closed?
- 6. What does the "clarity of Scripture" mean?
- 7. How does God make the Bible clear?

Questions for older children

- 1. Why is it important to know how to defend the canonicity of Scripture?
- 2. How would you explain to someone why we do not believe in the apocrypha as the word of God?
- 3. What does the "clarity of Scripture" mean for your daily life?
