



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Hebrews 1.1-2; John 16.13-14; 1 Corinthians 2.9-12 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What is the purpose of a flashlight?
- 2. How does the Holy Spirit help us see the truth of God's word?
- 3. Who and what guided the men who received the 66 books of the Bible as God's inspired word?
- 4. How is the formation of the Bible a miracle?
- 5. Now that we know which books are to be included in the Bible, why is it important to know what is included in each book?

Questions for older children

- 1. Describe how the Bible is different from all other books.
- 2. How can we be confident that we have the right books in our Bible?
- 3. How would you defend the canonicity of God's word?
