

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: 2 Timothy 3.10-17 *(one person read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. Who is teaching us when we read the Bible?
2. How can the Bible make a person "wise for salvation"? (2 Timothy 3.15)
3. Does the Bible tell us everything we want to know or everything we need to know about Jesus?
4. In what ways does the Bible reveal who Jesus is?

Questions for older children

1. If the Bible doesn't specifically forbid something, does that mean that God thinks it's OK to do it? Why?
2. How does reading the Bible guide your prayer life?
3. How does prayer help you read the Bible?
4. How did Jesus use the Scriptures in His life on earth?
