



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Matthew 13.31-33 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (*may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times*)

- 1. Is a mustard seed big or small? Can you think of small ways that God is at work?
- 2. What must happen in order for a seed to grow? Why is it important to hide God's Word in our hearts?
- 3. Who is the home God has provided for us?

Questions for older children

- 1. What are some small things you can do this week to enjoy God and His Word more?
- 2. What verse or passage can you hide in your heart this week, asking God to make it take root in you?
- 3. How has Jesus become our home? What difference does this make for us?
