

Praise

Call to Worship (everyone together)

And Mary said, "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for He has looked on the humble estate of His servant. For behold, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for He who is mighty has done great things for me, and holy is His name. And His mercy is for those who fear Him from generation to generation."

"Good Christian Men, Rejoice" (read or sing these words together)

Good Christian men, rejoice, with heart and soul and voice; Give ye heed to what we say: Jesus Christ is born today; Earth and heav'n before Him bow, and He is in the manger now. Christ is born today! Christ is born today!

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: John 1.9-13 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. Is everyone in the world a child of God?
- 2. What must happen for someone to be a child of God?
- 3. What does it mean to believe in His name?
- 4. What do we possess as children of God? Make as long a list as you can.
- 5. What does it mean to be born of God?
- 6. Are you a child of God?

Questions for older children

- 1. What is the connection between John 1.9-13 and John 3?
- 2. Why do you think the Lord calls us His children?
- 3. How does being His child impact you each day?
- 4. What benefit of being God's child is most difficult for you to believe?
- 5. How might your identity as a child of God change the way you see your life?
