



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: I Thessalonians 1.1-5a (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. To whom is Paul writing this letter?
- 2. What is the church?
- 3. Use I Thessalonians 1.1-5 to describe what you can about the church.
- 4. Why did Paul write the letter?
- 5. How can this same letter be helpful for our church in Dallas?

Ouestions for older children

- 1. Look again at verses 1-5. What stands out to you in Paul's description of the church?
- 2. Why did the Thessalonians need this letter from Paul?
- 3. Why do we need this letter from Paul?
- 4. Read 1 Thessalonians 5.27. Why did Paul finish his letter with this statement?
- 5. Try this: Sometime this week take a few minutes and read the entire letter out loud and reflect on what you read.
