Extending the Kingdom: Sanctity of Life

Acts 17.1-9

Now when they had passed through Amphipolis and Apollonia, they came to Thessalonica, where there was a synagogue of the Jews. ² And Paul went in, as was his custom, and on three Sabbath days he reasoned with them from the Scriptures, ³ explaining and proving that it was necessary for the Christ to suffer and to rise from the dead, and saying, "This Jesus, whom I proclaim to you, is the Christ." ⁴ And some of them were persuaded and joined Paul and Silas, as did a great many of the devout Greeks and not a few of the leading women. ⁵ But the Jews were jealous, and taking some wicked men of the rabble, they formed a mob, set the city in an uproar, and attacked the house of Jason, seeking to bring them out to the crowd. ⁶ And when they could not find them, they dragged Jason and some of the brothers before the city authorities, shouting, "These men who have turned the world upside down have come here also, ⁷ and Jason has received them, and they are all acting against the decrees of Caesar, saying that there is another king, Jesus." ⁸ And the people and the city authorities were disturbed when they heard these things. ⁹ And when they had taken money as security from Jason and the rest, they let them go.

1 Thessalonians 1.4-10

For we know, brothers loved by God, that He has chosen you, ⁵ because our gospel came to you not only in word, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction. You know what kind of men we proved to be among you for your sake. ⁶ And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, for you received the word in much affliction, with the joy of the Holy Spirit, ⁷ so that you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia. ⁸ For not only has the word of the Lord sounded forth from you in Macedonia and Achaia, but your faith in God has gone forth everywhere, so that we need not say anything. ⁹ For they themselves report concerning us the kind of reception we had among you, and how you turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God, ¹⁰ and to wait for His Son from heaven, whom He raised from the dead, Jesus who delivers us from the wrath to come.



“Receiving Affliction and Receiving Joy”

Order of Worship for the Home – The Week of January 26, 2014

Praise

Call to Worship *(everyone together)*

Your righteousness, O God, reaches the high heavens. You who have done great things, O God, who is like You? My lips will shout for joy, when I sing praises to You; my soul also, which You have redeemed.

“A Mighty Fortress Is Our God” *(read or sing these words together)*

That Word above all earthly pow'rs, no thanks to them, abideth;
The Spirit and the gifts are ours through Him who with us sideth.
Let goods and kindred go, this mortal life also;
The body they may kill; God's truth abideth still;
His Kingdom is forever.

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Acts 17.1-9; 1 Thessalonians 1.4-10 *(one person read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. Describe the affliction that took place in the church of Thessalonica (read Acts 17.1-9).
2. Why did they receive this affliction?
3. How did they respond to this affliction?
4. What is joy?
5. What is the joy of the Holy Spirit?
6. How did Christ show joy in the midst of affliction?

Questions for older children

1. Where do you see affliction taking place in the church today?
2. How should the church today anticipate and respond to affliction?
3. How do we receive the joy of the Holy Spirit in the midst of affliction?

Scripture Memory for January: *(memorize these verses of Scripture this month)*

Romans 5.1-2
