





Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: 1 Thessalonians 1.9-10; 1 Corinthians 11.23-26 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. Why were the people of the church of the Thessalonians waiting?
- 2. What were they doing while they were waiting?
- 3. Why is waiting hard?
- 4. Why do people say they want Christ to return?
- 5. Why is celebrating the Lord's Supper an important part of our waiting?

Questions for older children

- 1. Serving is active. Is waiting active or passive? Explain.
- 2. How is waiting hard for you?
- 3. How does this passage teach us to wait?

Scripture Memory for March (memorize these verses of Scripture this week)
