*The Scripture Reading

1 Thessalonians 2.1-12

For you yourselves know, brothers, that our coming to you was not in vain. ² But though we had already suffered and been shamefully treated at Philippi, as you know, we had boldness in our God to declare to you the gospel of God in the midst of much conflict. ³ For our appeal does not spring from error or impurity or any attempt to deceive, 4 but just as we have been approved by God to be entrusted with the gospel, so we speak, not to please man, but to please God who tests our hearts. ⁵ For we never came with words of flattery, as you know, nor with a pretext for greed—God is witness. 6 Nor did we seek glory from people, whether from you or from others, though we could have made demands as apostles of Christ. ⁷ But we were gentle among you, like a nursing mother taking care of her own children. ⁸ So, being affectionately desirous of you, we were ready to share with you not only the gospel of God but also our own selves, because you had become very dear to us. ⁹ For you remember, brothers, our labor and toil: we worked night and day, that we might not be a burden to any of you, while we proclaimed to you the gospel of God. ¹⁰ You are witnesses, and God also, how holy and righteous and blameless was our conduct toward you believers. ¹¹ For you know how, like a father with his children, ¹² we exhorted each one of you and encouraged you and charged you to walk in a manner worthy of God, who calls you into His own kingdom and glory.

- 6. Do you promise to be zealous and faithful in maintaining the truths of the Gospel and the purity and peace of the Church, whatever persecution or opposition may arise unto you on that account?
- 7. Do you engage to be faithful and diligent in the exercise of all your duties as a Christian and a minister of the Gospel, whether personal or relational, private or public; and to endeavor by the grace of God to adorn the profession of the Gospel in your manner of life, and to walk with exemplary piety before the flock of which God shall make you overseer?



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: 1 Thessalonians 2.1-12 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. Describe what was different about our worship service today.
- 2. What does it mean to be ordained for gospel ministry?
- 3. Read 1 Thessalonians 2.1-12 and answer the following questions: Where did they find their boldness? (v 2)
 What does it mean that *they were entrusted with the gospel*? (v 4)
 As they preached, who did they desire to please? (v 4)
 What did they desire to share with the people (v 8)
 Describe how they cared for the people (vs 7-8)

Questions for older children

- 1. What phrases from 2.1-12 stand out to you?
- 2. What was Paul's motivation in proclaiming the gospel?
- 3. What encourages you about the heart and mind of Paul in this passage?
- 4. Though the "charge" today was given to men being ordained for gospel ministry, how is this passage important for all of us?
