

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Mark 11.9-14; 20-22 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. How do these verses reveal that Jesus was fully man and fully God?
- 2. Why did Jesus curse the fig tree?
- 3. Who and what does the fig tree represent?
- 4. How might the cursing of the fig tree bring a blessing to people?
- 5. How important is the evidence of fruit in the life of a person who professes faith in Christ?
- 6. What evidence is there that Jesus hungers for fruit?

Questions for older children

- 1. How is this miracle different from all the other miracles? How is it the same?
- 2. What warning is Jesus giving in this miracle/parable?
- 3. How do people today look as if they have fruit, but upon closer examination there is no true fruit?
- 4. Where is God's grace in this passage?
- 5. Is there evidence of fruit in your life?

Scripture Memory for April: (memorize this verse of Scripture this month)

Romans 6.9-11

We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over Him. For the death He died He died to sin, once for all, but the life He lives He lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.
