Maundy Thursday

Father, in Your plan of salvation, Your Son Jesus Christ accepted the cross and freed us from the power of the enemy. May we come to share the glory of His resurrection, for He lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever.

Park Cities Presbyterian Church April 17, 2014 7:00 pm "Maundy Thursday" is a term which has a very rich meaning. "Maundy" is derived from the Latin phrase "Mandatum Novum," referring to the "new commandment" Jesus gave at the Last Supper for His disciples to love one another. It is a service which historically has commemorated the events which happened in the Upper Room: the washing of the disciples' feet, the new commandment, and the institution of the Lord's Supper.

Tonight's service ends with Tenebrae, or "the service of darkness." Tenebrae signifies the three hours of darkness which covered the earth while Jesus hung on the cross, as well as the literal darkness of the tomb. A single lit candle is brought in at the end of the service anticipating the resurrection. It is a beautiful depiction of the gospel: even as darkness was over the face of the deep at creation and God spoke light into the world, so at the dawning of the new creation was the Son of God shrouded in darkness until He burst forth in glorious light near dawn on Resurrection morning.


