



Exodus 19.1-8

On the third new moon after the people of Israel had gone out of the land of Egypt, on that day they came into the wilderness of Sinai. ² They set out from Rephidim and came into the wilderness of Sinai, and they encamped in the wilderness. There Israel encamped before the mountain, ³ while Moses went up to God. The LORD called to him out of the mountain, saying, "Thus you shall say to the house of Jacob, and tell the people of Israel: ⁴ You yourselves have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I bore you on eagles' wings and brought you to Myself. ⁵ Now therefore, if you will indeed obey My voice and keep My covenant, you shall be my treasured possession among all peoples, for all the earth is Mine; ⁶ and you shall be to Me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation. These are the words that you shall speak to the people of Israel." ⁷ So Moses came and called the elders of the people and set before them all these words that the LORD had commanded him.
⁸ All the people answered together and said, "All that the LORD has spoken we will do." And Moses reported the words of the people to the LORD.



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Exodus 19.1-8; 1 Peter 2.9-10 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. According to Exodus 19.4, what did God do for the people of Israel?
- 2. If you had your own treasure box, what would you put in it and why?
- 3. Why might God call Israel His "treasured possession"? (Ex. 19.5)
- 4. How does belonging to God affect the things we do and say?

Questions for older children

- 1. What are some ways you can proclaim the excellencies of God?
- 2. In 1 Peter 2.10, how does the Apostle Peter define God's people?
- 3. How has God shown mercy to you?

Scripture Memory for April: (memorize this verse of Scripture this month)

Romans 6.9-11

We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over Him. For the death He died He died to sin, once for all, but the life He lives He lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.
