

^{2.17} But since we were torn away from you, brothers, for a short time, in person not in heart, we endeavored the more eagerly and with great desire to see you face to face, 18 because we wanted to come to you -I, Paul, again and again - but Satan hindered us. 19 For what is our hope or joy or crown of boasting before our Lord Jesus at His coming? Is it not you? 20 For you are our glory and joy.

^{3.1} Therefore when we could bear it no longer, we were willing to be left behind at Athens alone, ² and we sent Timothy, our brother and God's coworker in the gospel of Christ, to establish and exhort you in your faith, 3 that no one be moved by these afflictions. For you yourselves know that we are destined for this. ⁴ For when we were with you, we kept telling you beforehand that we were to suffer affliction, just as it has come to pass, and just as you know. ⁵ For this reason, when I could bear it no longer, I sent to learn about your faith, for fear that somehow the tempter had tempted you and our labor would be in vain. ⁶ But now that Timothy has come to us from you, and has brought us the good news of your faith and love and reported that you always remember us kindly and long to see us, as we long to see you - 7 for this reason, brothers, in all our distress and affliction we have been comforted about you through your faith. 8 For now we live, if you are standing fast in the Lord. ⁹ For what thanksgiving can we return to God for you, for all the joy that we feel for your sake before our God, 10 as we pray most earnestly night and day that we may see you face to face and supply what is lacking in your faith? ¹¹ Now may our God and Father Himself, and our Lord Jesus, direct our way to you, ¹² and may the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all, as we do for you, 13 so that He may establish your hearts blameless in holiness before our God and Father, at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all His saints.



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: 1 Thessalonians 2.17-3.13 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. Look at the last verse in chapter 3 of Thessalonians. What is Paul's prayer?
- 2. Describe how Paul feels about the people he is writing to.
- 3. List two or three reasons why he sent Timothy to the people.
- 4. What is a report card? Why do teachers send out report cards? What does Timothy's report say about the people Paul is writing to?
- 5. How are we established in our faith?

Questions for older children

- 1. Summarize what Paul desires in these verses.
- 2. What can you learn from these verses about the way God establishes our faith?
- 3. Who are the people in your life seeking to establish your faith?
- 4. What is significant about the end of Paul's prayer?
