

People: Christ was exalted in His ascension, in that having after His

> resurrection often appeared unto and conversed with His apostles, speaking to them of the things pertaining to the Kingdom of God, and giving them commission to preach the gospel to all nations, forty days after His resurrection, He, in our nature, and as our head, triumphing over enemies, visibly went up into the highest heavens, there to receive gifts for men, to raise up our affections thither, and to prepare a place for us, where He Himself is, and shall continue till His second coming at the end of the world.

Public Confession of Sin

Minister: Since we have a great High Priest who has passed through the

heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. People:

*The Scripture Reading

Ephesians 4.1-16

I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, 2 with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, ³ eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. ⁴ There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call - 5 one Lord, one faith, one baptism, ⁶ one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all. ⁷ But grace was given to each one of us according to the measure of Christ's gift. 8 Therefore it says, "When He ascended on high He led a host of captives, and He gave gifts to men." ⁹(In saying, "He ascended," what does it mean but that He had also descended into the lower regions, the earth? ¹⁰ He who descended is the one who also ascended far above all the heavens, that He might fill all things.) 11 And He gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, 12 to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, ¹³ until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ, ¹⁴ so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes. 15 Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into Him who is the Head, into Christ, ¹⁶ from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love.



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Ephesians 4.1-16 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. When you think of a Church, what do you picture? What is the Church according to Pastor Paul?
- 2. What kind of people belong in the Church? Do you have to look a certain way? Do you have to be perfect to be in the Church?
- 3. What did Jesus give His people in order for His Church to grow?
- 4. What has God called the Church to display to the whole world?

Questions for older children

- 1. Who does the work of ministry in the Church? Is it the pastors or the people?
- 2. How have you been gifted by God? How can you use these gifts to love others?
- 3. Who are we supposed to love? People inside the Church or people outside the Church?
- 4. Why do we get together every Sunday morning to sing songs and hear sermons? Can you do this by yourself?
