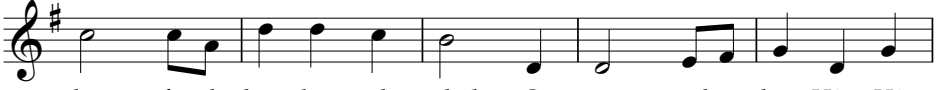

2. What is the condition of David’s soul and David’s surroundings?
3. In his condition, how does he view God?
4. How will David’s soul be satisfied?
5. How is David seeking the Lord?
6. What can we learn from David about seeking our Savior Jesus?
7. How is Christ our covering and the one our soul longs for more and more?

Questions for older children

1. Have you ever felt like you were in the wilderness? Describe:
2. What can we learn from David’s prayer that can enhance our own prayers?
3. In this prayer, how does David view God?
4. How does our view of God influence the way we pray?
5. Where is God when we pray?

Scripture Memory for July: *(memorize these verses of Scripture this month)*
