Hearing and Learning God’s Word

Scripture Reading: Exodus 14.29-31; 15.1-8, 11, 18-19; 16.1-3 *(one person read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. What did God do for the Israelites (what happened and in what order)?
2. Have you ever thought of God as a warrior?
3. How is what God did in the past to be understood in the present?
4. How does remembering give us our true identity as Christians?

Scripture Memory for July: *(memorize these verses of Scripture this month)*

Romans 8.26-27
