Hearing and Learning God’s Word

Scripture Reading: Psalm 5 *(one person read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. How does David describe his prayer in verses 1-2?
2. Read 5:6. How does God treat people who rebel against Him? Can you think of anyone in the Bible who rebelled against God?
3. Read 5:8. What is David’s specific request?
4. Read 5:11-12. Why had David become so confident?

Questions for older children

1. Does God only hear our prayers in the morning? Why is the morning so significant in the Bible?
2. Read 5:7. What is David’s attitude toward God?
3. How did David model for us how a mature and faithful Christian needs to be?
4. What do you need to do to have more of a sense that He is truly One True God, your LORD? What will this do for your life and relationships?
