

And the life of the child came into him again, and he revived. ²³ And Elijah took the child and brought him down from the upper chamber into the house and delivered him to his mother. And Elijah said, "See, your son lives." ²⁴ And the woman said to Elijah, "Now I know that you are a man of God, and that the word of the LORD in your mouth is truth."





Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: 1 Kings 17.17-24 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. Read 1 Kings 17.17-24 and retell the story in your own words.
- 2. How does this story reveal the pain of death?
- 3. How does this story show us the power of God?
- 4. Looking back at all of chapter 17, how do you see God's power revealed?
- 5. How can this story encourage Christians?

Questions for older children

- 1. Do you think the widow and Elijah were confused about why this happened?
- 2. What did Elijah do?
- 3. What can we learn about prayer in this passage?
- 4. What can we learn about God?
- 5. How does this text encourage you spiritually?

Scripture Memory for August: (memorize this verse of Scripture this month)
