



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: John 1.1-3 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. Why is "Word" capitalized in John 1.1?
- 2. Who is the Word?
- 3. When is the Word?
- 4. Where is the Word?
- 5. What did the Word do? (1.3)
- 6. What do we learn about Jesus from John 1.1-3 and Colossians 1.15-17?

Questions for older children

- 1. Read Genesis 1.1 and John 1.1. What is similar and what is different?
- 2. How does John's description of Jesus cause you to marvel at His glory?
- 3. Why do you think John begins his gospel this way?
