



"Grace upon Grace"

Order of Worship for the Home - The Week of October 19, 2014

Praise

Call to Worship (everyone together)

I will sing of the steadfast love of the LORD, forever; with my mouth I will make known Your faithfulness to all generations.

"Marvelous Grace of Our Loving Lord" (read or sing these words together)

Marvelous grace of our loving Lord, grace that exceeds our sin and our guilt, Yonder on Calvary's mount out-poured, there where the blood of the Lamb was spilt.

Grace, grace, God's grace, grace that will pardon and cleanse within; Grace grace, God's grace, grace that is greater than all our sin.

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: John 1.6-8; 15-18 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What does John 1.16 say we will receive from His fullness?
- 2. What is grace?
- 3. What is common grace?
- 4. What is saving grace?
- 5. What does the phrase "grace upon grace" mean and why is it important?
- 6. How has God shown you grace?

Questions for older children

- 1. In the Prologue (John 1.1-18) how many times does John give us the word grace?
- 2. Why is grace so important in our relationship with God?
- 3. How can we be more mindful of "grace upon grace"?

Scripture Memory for October: (memorize these verses of Scripture this month)

John 1.9-13

The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, yet the world did not know Him. He came to His own, and His own people did not receive Him. But to all who did receive Him, who believed in His name, He gave the right to become children of God, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.
