

Questions for Discussion *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. Let’s review something from last week. How is the verse “Grace upon Grace” like the ocean?
2. Do you ever wish you could see God?
3. What does John 1.18 tell us about who has seen God? (see also John 6.46)
4. What does the word *reveal* mean?
5. How has Jesus revealed who God is to us?
6. Why did Jesus have to become a man to reveal God to us?

Questions for older children

1. Why do you think “No one has ever seen God”?
2. How has Jesus made God known?
3. How does the Lord’s table help make God known?
4. How does the Lord’s table help us know who we are?

Scripture Memory for October *(memorize this verse of Scripture this month)*

John 1.9-13

The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, yet the world did not know Him. He came to His own, and His own people did not receive Him. But to all who did receive Him, who believed in His name, He gave the right to become children of God, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.

Prayer
