
Gently You raise me and heal my weary soul; You lead me by pathways of righteousness and truth; my spirit shall sing the music of Your name.

Psalm 90

Lord, You have been our dwelling place in all generations. ² Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever You had formed the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting You are God. ³ You return man to dust and say, "Return, O children of man!" 4 For a thousand years in Your sight are but as yesterday when it is past, or as a watch in the night. 



Praise

Call to Worship (everyone together)

The steadfast love of the LORD is from everlasting to everlasting on those who fear Him, and His righteousness to children's children, to those who keep His covenant and remember to do His commandments.

"In Christ Alone" (read or sing these words together)

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Psalm 90 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. Who was Moses?
- 2. What does Moses tell us about God?
- 3. What does Moses tell us about man?
- 4. Why does he tell us that God is angry, or for what reason is God angry? (vs. 7)
- 5. Why does he want us to number our days? (vs. 12)
- 6. What does Moses ask God to do?

Questions for older children

- 1. What is the context in which Moses is writing? (hint: it lasted 40 years)
- 2. What happened to the children of Israel in those 40 years?
- 3. How would this explain what Moses says in verses 1-11?
- 4. Moses asks God to do what three things in verses 12-17? (*see the verses with the word "us"*)
- 5. Why is a "heart of wisdom" important? (vs. 12)

Scripture Memory for November: (memorize these verses of Scripture this month)

John 1.14-18

And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen His glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth. (John bore witness about Him, and cried out, "This was He of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks before me, because He was before me.") For from His fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God; the only God, who is at the Father's side, He has made Him known.

Prayer
