

Praise

Call to Worship (everyone together)

The grass withers, the flower fades, but the Word of our God will stand forever. Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good news; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good news; lift it up, fear not; say to the cities of Judah, "Behold your God!"

"Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus" (read or sing these words together)

Come, Thou long-expected Jesus, born to set Thy people free; From our fears and sins release us; let us find our rest in Thee. Israel's strength and consolation, hope of all the earth Thou art, Dear Desire of ev'ry nation, joy of ev'ry longing heart.

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Isaiah 40.1-11 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What is the condition of the people of Israel when these words are given? (see Isaiah 39.5-6)
- 2. What does God offer His people?
- 3. How will God lead His people?
- 4. How does this passage point to Jesus?
- 5. How can this passage help us worship the Lord during this Advent season?

Questions for older children

- 1. Why is God bringing His people comfort?
- 2. How have you experienced the brokenness of this world?
- 3. How does this passage offer God's people concrete hope?

Scripture Memory for November: (memorize these verses of Scripture this month)

John 1.14-18

And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen His glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth. (John bore witness about Him, and cried out, "This was He of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks before me, because He was before me.'") For from His fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God; the only God, who is at the Father's side, He has made Him known.

Prayer
