Hearing and Learning God’s Word

Scripture Reading: Isaiah 50.4-11 *(one person read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. To whom is the servant of the Lord listening?
2. How does obedience relate to true listening?
3. Who does the servant sustain with a word? What does this mean?
4. How does the servant’s listening lead to suffering?
5. How can the servant endure the suffering?
6. What does the warning about torches mean in verses 10-11?

Questions for older children

1. How does verse 4 connect to Jesus’ title “Wonderful Counselor”?
2. What torches are you tempted to trust in? Why?
3. How is trusting in Jesus superior to trusting in torches?

Isaiah 9.6-7
