

Order of Worship for the Home - The Week of January 25, 2015

Praise

Call to Worship (everyone together)

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Job 1 and 2 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. Why is Job considered blameless and upright?
- 2. Who afflicts Job?
- 3. What is Job's response to his afflictions in chapter 1?
- 4. Is Satan free to do whatever he wants to do?
- 5. What do chapters 1 and 2 teach us about God?
