



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: John 4.1-42 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. How does this story reveal to us that Jesus is fully man and fully God?
- 2. What does Jesus offer the woman?
- 3. What is significant about the water Jesus is talking about?
- 4. How can a person receive this water?

Questions for older children

- 1. Why did Jesus have to pass through Samaria? (see verse 4)
- 2. List all the different intersections you see in this passage.
- 3. Describe the meaning of this water offered by Christ.
- 4. Have you received this living water?

Scripture Memory for February: (memorize these verses of Scripture this month)

John 5.19-20

So Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, the Son can do nothing of His own accord, but only what He sees the Father doing. For whatever the Father does, that the Son does likewise. ²⁰ For the Father loves the Son and shows Him all that He Himself is doing. And greater works than these will He show Him, so that you may marvel."
