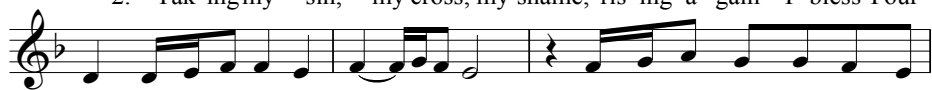

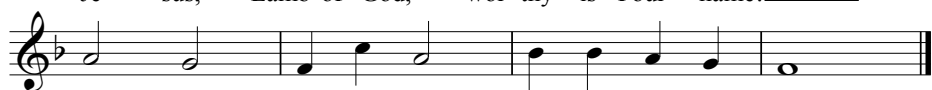

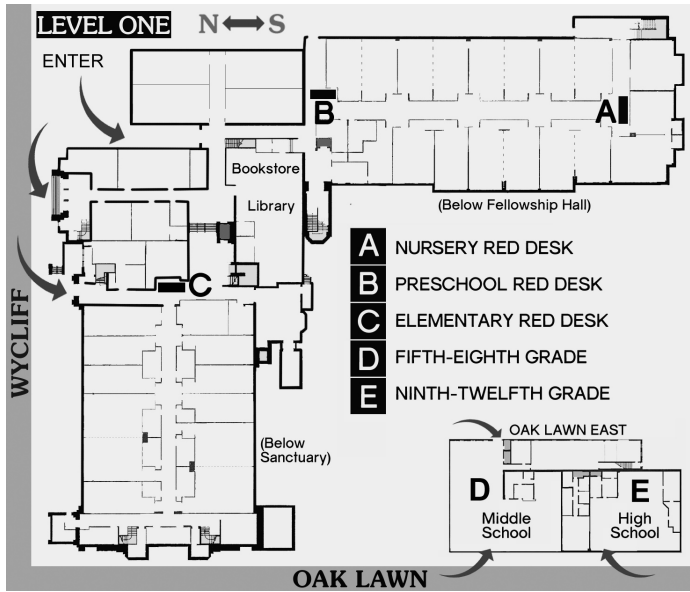

Hearing and Learning God’s Word

Scripture Reading: John 4.16-26 (*one person read the Scripture aloud*)

Questions for Discussion (*may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times*)

1. What is worship?
2. Why do Jesus and the woman at the well end up talking about worship?
3. What does verse 23 teach us about true worshipers?
4. What does it mean to worship *in spirit and truth*?
5. How can knowing that God seeks worshipers bless our worship?

Questions for older children

1. Is the woman Jesus is talking to someone God is seeking to become a worshiper?
2. What does this teach us about who God pursues to worship Him?
3. How does this whole story impact your worship of God?

Scripture Memory for February: (*memorize these verses of Scripture this month*)

John 5.19-20

So Jesus said to them, “Truly, truly, I say to you, the Son can do nothing of His own accord, but only what He sees the Father doing. For whatever the Father does, that the Son does likewise.²⁰ For the Father loves the Son and shows Him all that He Himself is doing. And greater works than these will He show Him, so that you may marvel.”
