John 12.9-28

When the large crowd of the Jews learned that Jesus was there, they came, not only on account of Him but also to see Lazarus, whom He had raised from the dead. ¹⁰ So the chief priests made plans to put Lazarus to death as well, ¹¹ because on account of him many of the Jews were going away and believing in Jesus.

¹² The next day the large crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. ¹³ So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet Him, crying out, "Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!" ¹⁴ And Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, just as it is written, ¹⁵ "Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your King is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!" ¹⁶ His disciples did not understand these things at first, but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things had been written about Him and had been done to Him. ¹⁷ The crowd that had been with Him when he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead continued to bear witness. ¹⁸ The reason why the crowd went to meet Him was that they heard He had done this sign. ¹⁹ So the Pharisees said to one another, "You see that you are gaining nothing. Look, the world has gone after Him."

Now among those who went up to worship at the feast were some Greeks. ²¹ So these came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." ²² Philip went and told Andrew; Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. ²³ And Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. ²⁴ Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. ²⁵ Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. ²⁶ If anyone serves Me, he must follow Me; and where I am, there will My servant be also. If anyone serves Me, the Father will honor him.

²⁷ "Now is My soul troubled. And what shall I say? 'Father, save Me from this hour'? But for this purpose I have come to this hour. ²⁸ Father, glorify Your name." Then a voice came from heaven: "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again."



SERMON NOTES

John 12.9-28

"Lazarus, a Donkey, and the Glory of God"

Order of Worship for the Home - The Week of March 29, 2015

Praise

Call to Worship (everyone together)

Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your King is coming to you; righteous and having salvation is He, humble and mounted on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.

"All Glory, Laud, and Honor" (read or sing these words together)

All glory, laud, and honor to Thee, Redeemer, King, To Whom the lips of children made sweet hosannas ring! Thou art the King of Israel, Thou David's royal Son, Who in the Lord's name comest, the King and blessed One!

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: John 12.9-28 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What impact did Jesus' raising Lazarus from the dead have on people?
- 2. What did the religious leaders want to do to Lazarus and why?
- 3. What is God's Glory?
- 4. How is Jesus going to be glorified in this passage?
- 5. What does His teaching about the wheat mean?

Questions for older children

- 1. How does God's glory fit into John 11 and 12?
- 2. How does Lazarus' death partially fulfill John 12.24?
- 3. How does the crowd and the council respond to Lazarus?
- 4. What is Jesus asking the Father for and what does it mean?

Scripture Memory for March: (memorize these verses of Scripture this month)

John 6.37-40

All that the Father gives Me will come to Me, and whoever comes to Me I will never cast out. For I have come down from heaven, not to do My own will but the will of Him who sent me. And this is the will of Him who sent me, that I should lose nothing of all that He has given me, but raise it up on the last day. For this is the will of My Father, that everyone who looks on the Son and believes in Him should have eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day.

Prayer
