

**Questions for Discussion** (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. Why does Jesus test Philip's faith?
- 2. How did Philip do with his test? Why did he respond the way he did?
- 3. What comfort can we take in knowing that Jesus already knew what He would do?
- 4. What does this miracle teach us about Jesus?
- 5. How can this miracle increase your faith?

#### Questions for older children

- 1. Which of God's attributes does this miracle affirm?
- 2. Describe a time when God tested your faith. How did it go?
- 3. What lessons of faith can we draw from this miracle?
