



- 2. What did Jesus say the disciples would be in verse 8?
- 3. What is a witness?
- 4. How does the Holy Spirit give us power to witness?
- 5. How can our church be a witness?
- 6. What did Jesus do after He said these things?

Questions for older children

- 1. Reread Acts 1.6-11. What inspires you about this passage?
- 2. How can you participate in the mission of Christ?
- 3. How have you experienced the power of the Holy Spirit?
- 4. How does the ascension of Christ give us hope?

Scripture Memory for May (memorize these verses of Scripture this month)

John 15.9-13

As the Father has loved Me, so have I loved you. Abide in My love. If you keep My commandments, you will abide in My love, just as I have kept My Father's commandments and abide in His love.
