

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: John 9 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What happened to the blind man?
- 2. Why did Jesus heal him?
- 3. What happened when Jesus healed him?
- 4. What was the most important question Jesus asked the blind man?
- 5. Besides the man's physical blindness, what else did Jesus heal?

Questions for older children

- 1. Why did the healing of the blind man create such a stir?
- 2. Why did so many miss the power and the point of the miracle?
- 3. When did God give you eyes to see?

Scripture Memory for June: (memorize these verses of Scripture this month)

John 10.14-16

I am the good Shepherd. I know My own and My own know Me, ¹⁵ just as the Father knows Me and I know the Father; and I lay down My life for the sheep. ¹⁶ And I have other sheep that are not of this fold.
