- ¹³ When the Spirit of truth comes, He will guide you into all the truth, for He will not speak on His own authority, but whatever He hears He will speak, and He will declare to you the things that are to come.
 - ¹⁴ He will glorify Me, for He will take what is Mine and declare it to you.





Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: John 16.1-15 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. Read 16.1-4; why was Jesus saying these things to His disciples?
- 2. Can you think of a time when God's word kept you from stumbling or going astray?
- 3. What kind of treatment can the disciples expect from the world?
- 4. What kind of treatment can we expect?
- 5. Why does Jesus refer to the Holy Spirit as "Another Helper"?
- 6. Have you ever wished you could have walked and talked with Jesus as one of His disciples? Why?

Questions for older children

- 1. When Jesus talks about going away, where is He going, and what will His going away accomplish?
- 2. Jesus said it was for their good that He was going away. In what ways was it better for the disciples to have the Holy Spirit than to have Jesus in the flesh? How is it better for us?
- 3. What would the Holy Spirit do in the world from verses 8-11?
- 4. Explain what "convicted of sin" means to you. Have you ever experienced the conviction of the Holy Spirit?
- 5. How has the Holy Spirit helped you in your Christian life? How has He guided you and helped you glorify Jesus?
- 6. How has the indwelling of the Holy Spirit been an advantage in your life?
