





#### Hearing and Learning God's Word

**Scripture Reading:** James 1.9-11 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

**Questions for Discussion** (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What does money reveal about our hearts?
- 2. What is sinful about pride?
- 3. What do you possess that will eventually fade away? What will last forever?
- 4. What does it mean to pursue the Kingdom of God?

#### Questions for older children

- 1. What is humility? What does humility have to do with Jesus Christ?
- 2. How does the promise of eternity change the way you live today?
- 3. What does it mean to treasure Jesus Christ?
- 4. What does it mean to be treasured by Jesus Christ?
