

2 Corinthians 9.6-15

Now this I say, he who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. ⁷ Each one must do just as he has purposed in his heart, not grudgingly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. 8 And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that always having all sufficiency in everything, you may have an abundance for every good deed; 9 as it is written,

> "He scattered abroad, he gave to the poor, His righteousness endures forever."

¹⁰ Now He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness;

¹¹ you will be enriched in everything for all liberality, which through us is producing thanksgiving to God. ¹² For the ministry of this service is not only fully supplying the needs of the saints, but is also overflowing through many thanksgivings to God. ¹³ Because of the proof given by this ministry, they will glorify God for your obedience to your confession of the gospel of Christ and for the liberality of your contribution to them and to all, ¹⁴ while they also, by prayer on your behalf, yearn for you because of the surpassing grace of God in you. ¹⁵ Thanks be to God for His indescribable gift!





Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: See selections on page four. (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. Jesus said it is more blessed (good) to give than receive. What does that mean?
- 2. How is Jesus an example of generosity (happy giving)?
- 3. Why does God love a happy giver?
- 4. What is it hard to give?

Questions for older children

- 1. What does Paul mean when he says, "God will supply all my needs"?
- 2. How does generous giving build a treasure for us in heaven? (1 Timothy 6.19; Philippians 4.17)
- 3. Why does cheerful giving make God happy?
- 4. Why does God supply me with abundance? (2 Corinthians 9.8)

Scripture Memory for October: (memorize these verses of Scripture this month)

James 1.22-25

But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. ²³ For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who looks intently at his natural face in a mirror. ²⁴ For he looks at himself and goes away and at once forgets what he was like. ²⁵ But the one who looks into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and perseveres, being no hearer who forgets but a doer who acts, he will be blessed in his doing.

Prayer
