

Scripture Reading: James 2.1-13 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What is James talking about in James 2.1-13?
- 2. What is partiality or favoritism?
- 3. Why do people show favoritism?
- 4. Why is it wrong to show favoritism?
- 5. What will help us not show favoritism?

Questions for older children

- 1. How do you show favoritism?
- 2. What does James question regarding those who show favoritism?
- 3. How can remembering our own story of rescue help us avoid showing favoritism?

Scripture Memory for November (memorize these verses of Scripture this month)

James 2.14-17

What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? ¹⁵ If a brother or sister is poorly clothed and lacking in daily food, ¹⁶ and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, be warmed and filled," without giving them the things needed for the body, what good is that? ¹⁷ So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead.
