

5. Where are Jesus’ disciples supposed to be willing to go?
6. Why is it important that Jesus will be with us as we go make disciples all over the world?

Questions for older children

1. Do you ever wish you had more authority?
2. How does someone get authority?
3. Why do you think Jesus talks about His authority before He tells His disciples to go?
4. According to verse 19 and 20, what two things are involved with making a disciple?
5. Is there a people group or nation where we are not supposed to make disciples? Why?
6. Why should Christians be encouraged to know that Jesus will be with them until the end of time?
7. Why do you think Jesus chose for these to be His last words on earth before He ascended to heaven?
8. How can you obey Jesus and make disciples?

Scripture Memory for November: *(memorize these verses of Scripture this month)*

James 2.14-17

What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? ¹⁵ If a brother or sister is poorly clothed and lacking in daily food, ¹⁶ and one of you says to them, “Go in peace, be warmed and filled,” without giving them the things needed for the body, what good is that? ¹⁷ So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead.

Youth and Families

Bahamas (Senior High Youth): March 5-12

Just a few steps away from the luxury of five-star resorts along the pristine beaches in Nassau is a troubled and desperate urban community where severe poverty, broken families, and corruption are pervasive. PCPC is partnering with St. Andrew's Kirk for a week of ministry to needy children, families, and elderly. The team will primarily serve a Christ-focused community center that provides a safe haven, tutoring, and healthcare for kids.

Texas-Mexico Border (Families): June 28-July 3

Serve alongside your whole family on the US-Mexico border. Support the work of home-church missionaries Jon and Libby White who serve at the Rio Grande Bible Institute which provides low cost seminary education to Hispanic leaders from across the Spanish-speaking world. Ministry will include serving children at an immigration center, light construction, painting, and a Spanish VBS program.

Zambia (Families): July 15-24

We are partnering with Arise Africa to work alongside different community schools to hold a kid's Bible camp for orphan and vulnerable children. Participants on this trip will work with children all day as well as volunteer at partnering organizations that Arise Africa specifically works with.

East Asia International Cultural Exchange –ICE (Youth and Families): June 28-July 11, July 30-August 8

Develop relationships with youth from across the world as you teach English at an East Asian school. Many of these students will come to Dallas for an exchange program in late July. They will stay with PCPC families for a week of English and cultural adventures that all serve to point them to the hope of Christ.

Adults

Japan Reverse Mission Trip: February 10-20

Help PCPC welcome seminary students from Christ Bible Institute in Nagoya, Japan on a reverse mission trip! We will host 15 Japanese seminary students for a week of learning about healthy models for ministries, serving cross-culturally, and sharing about the church in Japan. We need hosts and help with transportation.

Cuba: February 27-March 5

The heart of this East West Ministries mission trip will be personal evangelism alongside local believers. Contact Charles Debter for more information: cdebter@eastwest.org, 214-727-3158.

Japan: August 18-27

Join the team as PCPC young adults head to Tokyo and Nagoya, Japan where they will partner with local missionaries to minister to a group of young professionals through different evangelism opportunities. The team plans to serve alongside Brett and Taylor Rayl as they help with English classes at local cafes, mom's groups, and business professional environments.

Senegal: July 1-10

Enjoy sweet fellowship with leaders in God's church in West Africa during a week of pastoral training, women's ministry, and a VBS program for national pastors and their families. PCPC has helped plant 16 of the over 40 churches in this primarily Muslim country. Join this vital effort to build and strengthen the local church leaders. We specifically need 1-2 women to lead the teaching for pastors' wives and a team of 4-5 to lead the VBS ministry. 1 or 2 families with young children could easily participate.

Business-as-Mission**Senegal: March 11-20, June 3-12, and September 16-25**

PCPC is partnering with Videre to take three teams of business-minded people to disciple and empower local church leaders to provide for their families as well as to support the needs of the growing but financially struggling local church through small business enterprises. Videre seeks to fight spiritual and physical poverty by equipping the world's poor to build Gospel-centered businesses.

Italy: April 1-4

The details are just coming together, but Home Church Missionaries Hillary and Terrance Luker have recently requested the help of two business professionals with a business conference outreach in their community.

Justice**Tanzania: TBD**

African Leadership and Reconciliation Ministries (ALARM) seeks to raise up national leaders in Africa to address injustice, pursue reconciliation, and transform communities. ALARM addresses human rights abuses including sexual violence, bribery, arbitrary arrest, and the abuse of widows. God is using small groups of Christian lawyers, judges, and human rights advocates through short-term missions to teach leadership conferences and speak up for the poor and powerless.
